

Health Protocols for Covid-19

The following guidelines are in response to Covid-19 are in effect until further notice and must be adhered to while competing at our shows. In addition to these protocols, all Federal, State, and local laws that may be applicable must be followed. Management reserves the right to change these guidelines when and if it becomes necessary for the health and benefit of all. Failure to comply with the following guidelines may result in removal from the showgrounds. For more information on how to prevent illness, please visit www.cdc.gov.

If you plan to join us for the show, you MUST be able to assure management that neither you, nor anyone in your household:

- 1. Has tested positive or has been presumed positive for Covid-19 at any time during the past 14 days prior to the show.
- 2. Has been advised by a healthcare professional to self-quarantine at any time during the past 14 days prior to the show.
- 3. Has been in close physical contact with anyone who has tested positive or who has been presumed positive for Covid-19 during the past 14 days prior to the show.
- 4. Is subject to a quarantine order or a recommendation of a healthcare professional that, in either case, would make it inadvisable to attend a public event or competition.
- 5. Has, within the past 24 hours prior to the show, exhibited any of the following symptoms: fever of 100.4 or higher, cough, or shortness of breath.



The following guidelines will be in effect during the competition:

- 1. Social distancing guidelines must be followed at all times. The current guidelines call for 6' spacing between individuals that are not immediate family. Please DO NOT gather in large groups
- 2. Pursuant to USEF and state guidelines, management reserves the right to institute temperature checks on site, or prior to entry on the show grounds.
- 3. Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer to help reduce the spread of germs.
- 4. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth area with unwashed hands.
- 5. Please wear a cloth face cover or mask. Riders have the option to NOT wear a mask ONLY while mounted on the show grounds.
- 6. Please clean and disinfect all tack, equipment, and surfaces frequently that others may come in contact with. This includes golf carts, tack trunks, reins, halters, lead ropes, and other common itmes that may come into contact during the event.
- 7. Please use trash receptacles to reduce the chance that staff does not have to come in contact with potentially contaminated items that have not been discarded properly.
- 8. All competitors and attendees are responsible for monitoring their own personal and family health prior to, during, and after attending the competition.
- 9. TRAINERS WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE for the conduct and adherence to these rules and guidelines set forth during the competition. Trainers and/or barns are subject to removed from the showgrounds if these guidelines are not followed. Please discuss with each individual in your group on the importance of



following rules and the direction of horse show staff and security personnel.

- 10. In order to avoid large crowds, competitors will be allowed onto the showgrounds the day prior to competing. The competitor may be on the grounds on the days of which they compete but must leave as expeditiously as possible following the completion of their last class.
- 11. Until further notice, the competition is open ONLY to Trainers, Riders, Grooms, Owners, Competition Staff, and parents attending as a minor's guardian.
- 12. Until further notice, NO Spectators, NO extended family members, or Friends are allowed to enter the showgrounds. If you are NOT directly involved with a horse or pony competing, then you are NOT allowed on the showgrounds.
- 13. Any Barn or Trainer found in violation of current nonessential personnel guidelines may be removed from the grounds.
- 14. All vehicles and trainers entering the competition grounds will be subject to be stopped at the front entrance for inspection and prof of admittance
- 15. Dogs must be kept under control and confined or leashed at ALL TIMES.
- 16. Please keep your time spent on the showgrounds to a minimum in order to limit contact and exposure to yourself and others that are attending the competition.
- 17. Online entries are HIGHLY RECOMMENDED. Please visit our website to enter online at www.harmonclassics.com OR you can email them in to harmonclassics@aol.com.

- 18. The horse show office will be limited to just one trainer/representative per barn. Masks will be mandatory to wear while in the show office.
- 19. Please do not crowd the ingate area. Courses will be posted on the course boards and will also be available online and through social media each day.
- 20. Check in procedures for classes will be announced closer to the start date of the show and may include posted orders of go if necessary.

We would like to thank everyone in advance for their cooperation during these times and for your compliance and cooperation in keeping the competition grounds, our family, and staff as safe as possible. Everyone is eager to return to showing, but we need everyone's cooperation and understanding to make this work.
